The church council has faced many tough decisions as of late due to Covid-19. As you probably are aware, Sunday school has been cancelled until further notice. This decision was heart-wrenching for the council, but the decision was made out of compassion and concern for the well-being of our children and Sunday school staff. We are continuing with in-person worship services at both MLC and ILC at 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. respectively. November 29th was our first day in doing this and it went well; however, the video took approximately 7 hours to

upload to YouTube. The church has purchased a GoPro video camera, and I hope to become more proficient with this equipment and the whole video/internet process to provide you with a quality recording that you may watch in the comfort of your own homes. Stay tuned for updates and status reports.

We recently took a poll of the congregation about holding the traditional Christmas Eve church service and the resounding response was in-favor of holding the Christmas Eve service. However, the council may discuss this further depending on changes in the Covid-19 situation and make their decision. Stay tuned for further updates.

Christmas is a time of anticipation and excitement for young and old. This is what Jesus wants. He wants us to get excited again about our relationship with Him. Committee Business

- Worship & Shepherding (Kelly, Lonnie)
 - Christmas Eve worship service discussion

 there are a lot of concerns right now
 with gathering that many people in 1 spot.
 The ND restart plan shows now that as a state for events and gatherings,
 occupancy should be limited to 25% at no more than 50 people. Kelly will check into the possible set-up of a YouTube channel in case we need to go virtual for the service. If we have services, we need to require face masks
